Methodology for Emergency Financial Aid Grants Under Section 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA Act

USC Upstate CRRSAA Act Funds Award Methodology

USC Upstate awarded students that had completed the 19-20 FAFSA, and met the Title IV Federal Financial Aid eligibility requirements, Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements, and not enrolled in exclusively online classes. Pell Grant recipients were awarded \$1000, if enrolled in 12 hours and \$500 if enrolled in less than 12 hours. Eligible Non-Pell students with an EFC less than or equal to \$10,000 were awarded \$650, if enrolled in at least 12 hours and \$250 if enrolled in less than 12 hours. Non-Pell students with an EFC greater than \$10,000 were awarded \$450 if enrolled in 12 hours and \$250 if enrolled in less than 12 hours. Graduate students were awarded \$250.
