NOTE: All Graduate Assistants are on a 12-month contract (June 1, 2025-May 31, 2026). **Graduate assistants will use the \$30,000 to pay in-state tuition**, and the remaining balance per semester will be distributed in a bi-monthly stipend totaling **(~\$21,416) that is then paid bi-monthly across 12 months**. Students are responsible for the balance remaining on their tuition bills.
